Diversified and Abundant Amenities

Completed Water Park and Diversified Activities

Since March 2004, the water parks with leisure green corridors, pedestrian paths, landscape pavilions and curved bridges were completed one after another, such as the Siraya Plaza, Siake Lake, Taoye Lake, and Yingsi Lake. The Siraya Plaza accommodates several performance venues for performances and exhibitions of various scales and nature. The Administration worked with the STSP Enterprises to hold the STSP Beer Festival Outdoor Movies and Concerts in August, October, and November of 2004. The performance venues, also open for the public to host any cultural activities, are where the STSP employees and local residents can go to spend their leisure time. Since December 1, 2004, the Administration also prepares fishing permits for people to apply in order to fish at the landscape lakes. The STSP employees can also enjoy fishing in the Park.

Introduction of the Service Industry and International Hotel

Apart from the entry of certified public accountant (CPA) firms, law firms, travel agencies, securities, and banks, the Administration also introduced the Internet service industry on July 12, 2004, which started operation on November 20, 2004. In addition, Chiao Tung Bank also established its STSP branch in October 2004 to offer diversified financial services.

The STSP aims to make it more life-friendly. In order to provide full range of services, including accommodation, food, educational training and conferences facilities, for the STSP employees and businessmen, the STSP plans to build a STSP business hotel in the southwest of the Administrative Service Zone via BOT, which is the first one ever in Science Parks in Taiwan. After the open bidder, the Ambassador Hotel was then publicly selected on December 28 of 2004 to be the first hotel coming into the Science Park.

Enhancement of Amenities

In order to satisfy the busy technology professionals, the STSP provides a quality space for them - Park17 shopping mall. Park17 shopping mall accommodates various western and quick restaurants with different styles as well as local snack shops to make sure there is something for everyone. To make Park17 shopping mall a leisure and business center, the Administration also worked with 7-11 to host 11 concerts in 2004 and received much feedback.

In order to make the STSP employees and business visitors familiarize with the STSP quickly, the Administration also compiled the "STSP Living Map," "Guide Book of STSP," the Japanese version of enterprises recruitment booklets, the Japanese version of "Business Manual," as well as the Chinese, English, and Japanese versions of "Annual Report." These publications are free to the public and received much appreciation.

Innovative Services for Foreign Enterprises

The STSP has 11 Japanese enterprises and 3 American enterprises with a total of 182 foreign employees. In order to reduce the language barrier, the Administration set up a "Specialized Team for Foreign Enterprises" on January 20 ,2004, which will answer all kinds of investment questions that the foreign enterprises may have when they invest.

To better serve the Japanese enterprises within the STSP, the Administration assisted the Japanese enterprises in setting up the "Exchange Association for Japanese Enterprises Employees" on March 6, 2004. The Association aims to deal with the common issues of the Japanese employees, promote welfare measures, and enhance the relationship between the Japanese enterprises within the STSP. In addition, speeches, leisure activities, and visits are held at irregular intervals for the Japanese employees within the STSP to exchange their living experience in Taiwan. 4 activities in total were held in 2004 and attracted 210 person-times of participation from Japanese employees and their family, showing a great success.

In order to help the spouses of the Japanese investors to fit in the life here, the Administration also set up a "Reading Group for Spouses of Japanese Employees" on January 10, 2004. The wife of the Director-general, Dr. Jue-jane Liu, was invited to lead the group. The Reading Group's first activity was held on January 10, 2004. The Group participants were led to Xinda Harbor to visit the production of mullet roe and taste the mullet roe. The activities held afterwards also received much appreciation. 2 activities were held in 2004 and attracted 75 person-times of participation from Japanese employees and their family.





Developing the Administrative Service Zone as a Small-scale World Trade Center

The Administrative Service Zone covers 27 acres of land. The Administration Building, Police Building, and National Center for High-performance Computing Building were completed and started operation since January 30, 2005. The business hotel operated by the Ambassador Hotel is expected to start construction in May 2005 and complete during the middle of 2007. The Convention & Exhibition Center (including the International Conference Hall) and the Financial Center are scheduled to start construction in October 2005 and complete in December 2007. All the above facilities will make up a world trade center within the STSP.

Constructive Transportation Management

In order to improve the inward and outward transportation of the STSP, the traffic signals of the 50meter wide main lines - Nanke South/North Road and Siraya Boulevard within the STSP are all coordinated. Drivers spend less time waiting for the traffic light and the commute time is decreased. The transportation within the STSP is smoother and more convenient. The STSP also targeted the spots that have higher accident rates for improvement, such as the intersection of the access road to the south of Nanke South Road and County Road S. 134, and intersection of Siraya Boulevard and Huandong Road. The hardware facilities and time intervals of the traffic lights are adjusted in accordance with the needs of drivers to increase the road safety and convenience.

To reduce the rush hour traffic of Singangshe Boulevard (the access road to the south of the STSP), the Administration requested the assistance from the Tainan County Government to send more traffic policemen from Traffic Police Brigade of Tainan County Police Bureau and Shanhua Police Precinct. These police carry out their duties on the spot at Singangshe Boulevard, Provincial Highway No. 1, the Hsinshih interchange of National Expressway No. 8, and access roads of the STSP to manually control the traffic lights based on the traffic flow and have effectively reduced the traffic density during rush hours.
