Excellent Results of Domestic and International Enterprises Recruitment

To enhance the enterprises recruitment effectiveness and introduce the STSP to domestic and international enterprises, the Administration has participated in many domestic and international recruitment activities. Moreover, the Administration also tries to engage the attention of students by holding 3 recruitment fairs on campus in northern, central and southern Taiwan. The Administration hopes to promote the public image of the STSP starting from the campus.

International Enterprises Recruitment Activities

Together with the representatives from the Kaohsiung County Government, the Computer & Communication Research Laboratories of the Industrial Technology Research Institute, a group of economic, trade, and technological experts from the Taiwan Russia Association, and the delegates of Kaohsiung Science Park visited Russia for technology exchanges. The delegation visited the Russian Academy of Sciences to establish a bilateral platform of technology exchange. The delegation then attended the forum for bilateral technology exchanges and cooperation between Taiwan and Russia. In addition, the delegation also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Russian Union of Innovative - Technological Centers (RUITC) and brought back more than 20 kinds of technical data for domestic enterprises. This recruitment event also attracted several doctors of the Russian Academy of Sciences to visit the STSP in person in November 2004.

As the Kaohsiung Science Park is constructing a telecommunications zone with the establishment of the Telecommunications Technology Center, the delegation also visited the Kista Science Park in Sweden and the Hermia Science Park in Finland, the two most important telecommunications zones worldwide, for their relevant experience. In addition, the delegation also met up with Ericsson of Sweden and Nokia of Finland, two global leading telecommunications giants, who can serve as very good models for the enterprises of the telecommunications zone in the Kaohsiung Science Park.

From October 18 to 29, 2004, the representatives of the Administration and Tainan County Government flew to 5 cities in the U.S. and Canada (including San Francisco, San Diego, Dallas, St. Louis, and Vancouver) for enterprises recruitment. 5 recruitment presentations titled "The STSP - a Waving Hand From

The New Silicon Valley in Taiwan to the U.S. and Canada" were held together with some visits to companies and attracted much press attention. Moreover, the Administration also signed a MOU with MedWaves and Mediomics in the U.S. as well as the Council of Science and Technology of B.C. Canada. MedWaves is a manufacturer of biomedical therapeutic device while Mediomics specializes in protein gene test. During the stay in San Diego, the representative of the City Mayer even presented Honorary Citizen to Tainan County Governor Su, Director-general Tai, and the entire delegation. These activities above successfully promote the public image of the STSP overseas.



Overseas Talents Recruitment Activities

"The 2004 Career Exposition for Overseas High-Tech Talent of the Executive Yuan" was organized by the Ministry of Economic Affairs and the National Science Council and implemented by the Chung Hua Institution for Economic Research. Mr. Ferng-ching Lin, Minister without Portfolio of the Executive Yuan, was invited to lead the delegation. 11 overseas technology groups were invited by the R.O.C. representative office abroad to organize the delegation's visit agenda. Another 43 leading domestic high-tech companies were invited to join the delegation. The delegation flew to San Francisco, Los Angeles, Dallas, Chicago, New York, and Tokyo, where the technology professionals gather, for recruitment from September 9 to 24, 2004.

On behalf of the domestic science parks, the Administration joined the delegation to introduce the current situation and future prospects of the 3 Science Parks of Taiwan to the overseas high-tech professionals. 6 recruitment presentations were held by the delegation in 2004 and attracted 1,850 overseas technology professionals to the interviews. In addition, 1,150 questionnaires about these professionals' intentions to work in Taiwan were collected.
